And in [Grand Junction](#), catch us every Thursday evening from 5:30 PM to 8:00 PM, beginning July 10th and continuing until September 25th.

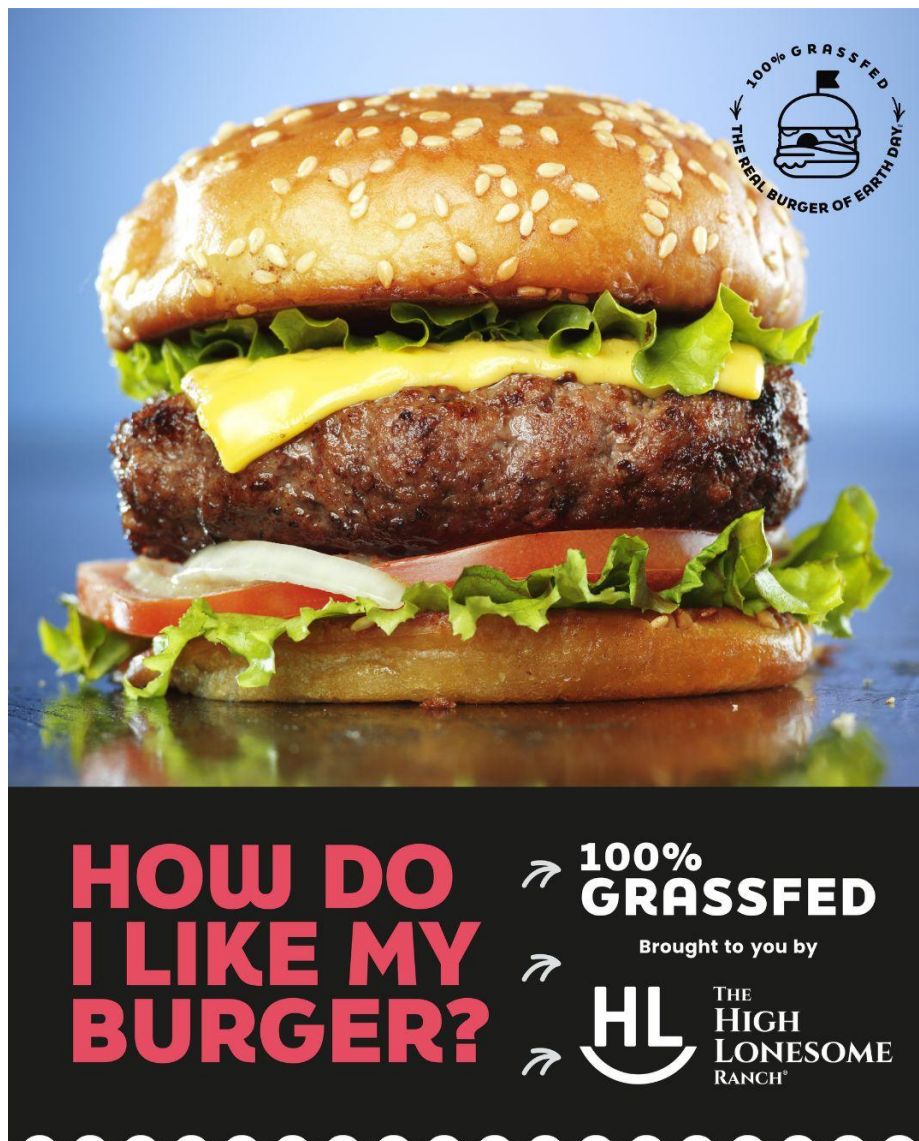

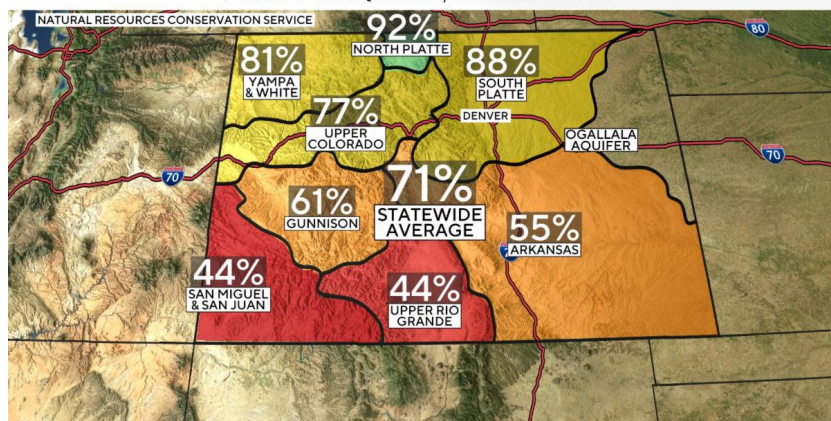
